Hello Section Governor,

The 99s give out awards at our annual conference to honor members of our organization and communities. The annual meeting this year is in San Antonio, Texas.

Three separate Awards of Achievement may be presented each year. The three awards are:

- a. The <u>Award of Achievement for Contributions to The Ninety-Nines</u> which recognizes a significant contribution to the mission of the 99s or any of the organization's activities.
- b. The <u>Award of Achievement for Contributions to Aviation</u> which recognizes significant contributions to any facet of aviation, such as aviation/aerospace education, aviation science, aviation history, aviation commerce, aviation legislation, etc.
- c. The <u>Award of Achievement for Humanitarian Efforts</u> which recognizes significant contribution, through aviation, in a humanitarian effort.

In addition, two other awards may be presented to "non-99s." The first one, the <u>George Palmer Putnam Award</u>, is given in recognition of support of The 99s. The other award, the <u>Award of Merit</u>, is given to recognize a contribution(s) made to aviation in general. Each of these awards may be presented to an individual or an organization. Individual winners may be male or female.

I am sure that you know several people or groups who deserve special recognition. Recipients may be living or deceased and from any country. The contribution may have occurred at any time in the past or present, as a single action or a series of events.

The nominating requirements are very simple:

- A. Nominations may be submitted by a Chapter, a Section or the Trustees within The Ninety-Nines accompanied by two officer-signatures or trustees as applicable.
- B. The nomination should be in the form of a one-page letter and up to three additional pages of substantiating material. The name, addresses, and phone number of the nominee or the nominee's next of kin, if the nominee is deceased, should be included. A high-resolution photo should be included and local P.R. contact information is requested.
- C. The nomination should give complete, but concise, details justifying the award to the nominee with such background information as considered pertinent, and any other relevant information, that would assist the Awards Committee.
- D. Nominations from previous years may be resubmitted.
- E. Nominations should be sent to The Ninety-Nines Headquarters to the attention of the Awards Committee.

The event was geared to youth groups and schools.

Chapter Membership: 31 with 2 student pilot new members, 1 long time pilot new member and several more potentials including a reinstatement.

Flying Activities: We had three chapter members (Janet Gonzales, Kelli Kuntz, and new member Julie Jones (Got her to join as she was leaving for the race)) who made up the Classic Cajuns team in the Air Race Classic. On the way to Prescott, Arizona they stayed

in Roswell, NM. There they picked up Alien Alice (now known as Green Alice or GA) who participated in the race every step of the way. The Classic Cajuns may not have finished in the top 10 but they were first in the fun category. They kept the chapter involved in their experiences through a group text. GA also went to Ottawa, Oshkosh and Reno.

Impromptu chapter lunch fly-ins are becoming part of our chapter activities. So far we've had July 19th, August 31st, September 2nd, September 9th, and a pancake breakfast on September 3rd. These are known as field trips and are recorded on videos.

Education Events: Meetings are held every month usually on the 2nd Tuesday. Each meeting starts with a Safety moment, which leads to good discussions of personal experience to make us all safer pilots.

One of our guests at the July 12th meeting was Ines Fouquet, a 17 year old foreign exchange student from France who was hosted by Janet Gonzales. Ines had begun her flight training in France but had not had an opportunity to land the airplane. Janet made sure she obtained that experience early in her stay and she then went on to greatly advance her skills. On July 19th Ines flew with Janet to a chapter fly-in for lunch at Stennis (KHSA). Upon returning to Louisiana Regional (L38) Ines joined the 99s and is looking forward to applying for a Fly Now scholarship.

Also in the July meeting the new Stennis Regulatory Special Use Airspace was explained.
