April 30,2022

The meeting was called to order at 9:03am EDT by Janice Pelletti, Southeast Section Governor. Janice thanked the Treasure Coast Chapter for the excellent job they have done hosting the Spring Section.

Janice Pelletti welcomed everyone.

The chapter roll call was made by Janice McWilliams, Southeast Section Secretary. A quorum was declared.

Lois Horne, Southeast Section Vice Governor introduced the Southeast Section (SES) Board members: Janice Pelletti Governor, Lois Horne Vice Governor, Janice McWilliams Secretary, Caroline Hodges Treasurer, Anita Mixon Director, Michele Sonier Director (attending virtually), Ramona Banks Immediate Past Governor.

Ramona Banks reported on the growth of the Nashville Chapter and Janice Pelletti recognized a first-time attendee from the Nashville Chapter Bunnie Ambrose. Janice Pelletti announced that Anita Mixon will be providing an article for the next SES Constant Contact about the AOPA Airport Support Network Volunteers. Janice Pelletti noted that Michelle Sonier, Director is attending the meeting virtually and members can read her report in the packet. Janice added that the treasurers report was in the meeting packet and any questions could be emailed to Caroline Hodges. Complete reports are in the packet.

Loise Horne introduced Dr Monica Randolph Graham International Director.

Monica thanked the Treasure Coast for a wonderful meeting. Monica's International report was as follows;

4. The Ninety-Nines ensures long-term financial strength and sustainability by increasing revenue.

New this Year – A Luncheon for Life Members!

Thanks to an anonymous donor, a luncheon for Ninety-Nines Life Members will be held immediately following the July 9 Annual Meeting in recognition of their commitment to The Ninety-Nines.

International Forest of Friendship

There are fifteen slots for members to be inducted into the International Forest of Friendship. The next induction will be September the 16-18. 2022
Monica asked for questions. There were no questions.

Caroline Hodges, Treasurer gave the financial report. The report goes through the end of March.

- Our general funds are very close to budget.
- Most of our income is from dues.
- The Wasp lunch brought in \$925 by the end of March but the total profit is expected to be \$1150.
- Next year the New Horizons Scholarship will be \$3500, due to a \$1000 donation, this is a one-time increase.
- Our SES fund raiser was very successful with close to a \$4000 profit.
- We have recurring donations of \$1600.
- Some expense items have increased such as hotel costs, and bank expenses.
- There is a projected net income of \$7000 for the year.

Caroline then reviewed the budget for 2022-2023.

- The income from dues remains flat.
- There is no interest income, however in the coming year the SES plans to look into investing.
- There is no fund raiser in the budget.
- Office expenses and website cost remained flat.
- Bank charges were increased.
- WASP lunch expense was zeroed out.
- Chapter outreach and Governors expenses remained flat.
- Section meeting expenses were bumped up due to increase in hotel cost.
- The cost of \$1000 for the International Conference Hospitality Suite and \$250 for the SES Conference Meeting Room were added to the budget.
- Contributions remained the same as last year for the Amelia Earhart Birthplace, Museum of Women Pilots, NIFA, and the International Forest of Friendship.

Caroline asked for questions. Janice McWilliams asked if we were going to put the \$1500 that we had allocated for the WASP lunch into funds for the International Conference Hospitality Suite. Janice Pelletti answered no, we would be working with International on that. Vicki Greenleaf from the Heartland Chapter expressed concerns about the increased bank charges. Caroline explained the increased charges were credit card processing costs from Authorize .net not actual bank fees. Janice Pelletti asked if there were any more questions. There were no questions. Janice Pelletti asked for a motion to accept the proposed 2022-2023 budget. Rosemary Gibson, Kitty Hawk Chapter so moved and Terry Carbonell Paradise Coast seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Committee Reports

Ramona Banks gave the Ways and Means Committee report. The current Account balance for Ways and Means is \$4950. Amy Maselli from Richmond, Virginia won the SES fund raiser raffle for \$1000. We will not have a fund raiser this year. Ramona encouraged everyone to consider giving a \$5 a month recurring donation.

Kim Elsholz, FL Suncoast Chapter reported that we still have SES jewelry for sale in the meeting room foyer

Janice Pelletti reported that the 5013c report from Jeanne Burklund is in the meeting packet.

Lois Horne SES Airmarking Chair reported on Airmarking. Airmarking is a great way to get our brand out. Let Lois know if you plan a compass rose, she may be able to help with discounted paint and she can help you plan. Please send photos of airmarking to Lois.

Janice Pelletti presented the proposed bylaw changes. There are two housekeeping changes as reported in the email sent to the SES members sixty days in advance of this business meeting. The bylaw changes are in the bylaws report in the meeting packet. The SES board is recommending approval of the changes. The changes have been approved by the International Bylaws Committee and international Legal Counsel. Lois Horne, Memphis Chapter made the motion to approve the bylaw changes as submitted in the packet. Terry Carbonell, Paradise Coast Chapter seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

Ruth Jacobs Education Committee Chair reported that she had not received any chapter reports on Girl Scout activities. Ruth submitted for the meeting packet a construction plan for a paper airplane that chapters may be able to use as an educational tool.

Mary Woody Membership Committee Chair was not able to attend today, her report is in the meeting packet.

Marilyn Schafer NIFA Chair for the 99s International reported NIFA Nationals are May 9-14, 2022. Marilyn thanked the 99s for their generous donations to NIFA. The donations allowed the 99s Women Achievement Awards to be increased this year to \$2000 1st place, \$1000 2nd place and \$750 3rd place. She thanked everyone for their support of NIFA and encouraged us to get involved.

Ramona Banks reported on SES social media and the website. Ramona asked that we direct new members to the SES Facebook page and send items to share on Facebook. Remember to post Air Race Classic events on your Chapter Facebook and send to Ramona for the SES Facebook. Ramona is still working on our SES website and hopes to finish it after the International Conference.

Lois Horne Chair of the New Horizons Scholarship Committee started her report by remembering those in the SES who have gone on to New Horizons;

Lois Horne acknowledged the members of the New Horizon Scholarship committee; Rosemary Gibson, Laurie Reeves, Caroline Hodges, Janice Pelletti and Lois Horne. This year the scholarship award is \$3500 due to a \$1000 donation. Lois Horne announced Irene Lopez, Fl Goldcoast is the 2022 winner of the SES New Horizons Scholarship. Irene will be using the scholarship for her CFI Certificate rating.

Janice Pelletti reported that Myra Bugbee, Let's Fly Now International Chair is asking the SES to host a Let's Fly Now event in Charleston on Sunday July 10, 2022 immediately following the International Conference. Janice informed us that the SES will need to vote on having the event or not. Terry Carbonell gave the Let's Fly Now report on behalf of Myra Bugbee who was attending virtually. Let's Fly Now is now on the 99s International website. The initial launch of Let's Fly Now was cut short due to the Covid pandemic so Myra would like to have a relaunch starting with the proposed Charleston event. Terry said she would be volunteering to fly if we decide to have the Let's Fly Now event

Terry gave the following points to consider concerning a Let's Fly Now Event in Charleston;

- Pilot and planes, a ground crew of at least ten and one CFI will be needed
- Water, maybe lunch and logbooks will need to be provided
- Registration for Let's Fly Now is online
- Myra spoke with the local airport manager and the airport is supportive of the idea of the event
- Jenny Conway 99 in Charleston gave Myra local contacts for helping advertise the event
- Myra can help get things set up but she will not be available for three weeks prior to the conference

Janice Pelletti opened the floor for discussion and informed us that discussion will be limited to ten minutes. Mae Marquet commented that the NOLA chapter had a very successful Let's Fly Now Event. Mae suggested the SES board could consider using some of the money in the budget allocated for outreach towards helping with Let's Fly Now Events. Ramona Banks expressed concerns about the SES running the hospitality suite plus transportation and the Let's Fly Now. Ramona also reminded everyone of the work and time they would be committing to if we have the event. Janice McWilliams asked if someone would need to volunteer to be in charge due to Myra's absence in June. Terry answered that she spoke to Myra, and it would not be necessary for someone to volunteer to be in charge. Terry added that Monica Randolph Graham has volunteered to help and has experience putting on Let's Fly Now Events. Janice Pelletti asked if there were any more comments or questions, there were none. Janice asked for a motion to have a Let's Fly Now Event in Charleston on July 10th, Terry Carbonell so moved. Katie Koch, FL Goldcoast seconded the motion. Janice Pelletti called for a show of hands, there were 11 for and 12 against. The first vote did not include the members attending virtually so another vote was called for. The motion failed with a vote of 15 for and 17 against.

Ellen Herr gave the Trailblazers in Aviation Lunch Report on behalf of Myra Bugbee. The Sun n Fun WASP Lunch is now the Trailblazers in Aviation Lunch because there are no WASPs able to come to Sun n Fun. Myra is stepping down as chairperson for the lunch and Anita Mixon will be taking over.

Kim Elsholz gave the 99 of Note Award report. Anita Mixon, Kim Elsholz, Beverly Mautner and Kelli O'Donnel are the 99 of Note Committee Members. Last year eleven chapters submitted nominations. Karen Weldon was last year's winner so Karen will be asked to be on the selection committee for this year. Submissions are due by August 31st. Chapters were encouraged to use this award to recognize a 99 in their chapter. The winner's name is added to a plaque that hangs in the 99's house in Lakeland

Meagan Harr was not in attendance to give the nominating committee report. Janice Pelletti reminded everyone that the deadline to submit your intent to seek election is Nov 20, 2022. Positions are open for governor, vice governor, secretary, treasurer, 2 directors and 3 nominating committee members. There will be a break-out session after today's business meeting for members who are interested in serving as a SES officer or on the international board to speak to a current officer.

Lois Horne gave the Air Race Classic (ARC) report. There are several stops for the ARC in the SES this year. Many different types of volunteers are needed including; community outreach, fund raising, photography, timers, hospitality. Joann Alcorn, Heartland Chapter spoke about the ARC start in Lakeland, FL. Joann is the chair for the ARC start in Lakeland, FL and she is looking for volunteers to help in Lakeland. Anita Mixon has volunteered to coordinate the hospitality at the Lakeland start, and is looking for helpers with hospitality. Other volunteers needed include; sales, helpers for the youth event, cart drivers, photographers, timers and more. The ARC is June 15-21. This year so far there are 119 racers and 53 teams. Ramona Banks is the ARC stop chair for the Muscle Shoals, AL stop. Lois Horne will be the Tullahoma, AL stop chair. Aileen Watkins will be helping in Moultrie, GA.

I have been working closely with the International Conference and Career Expo (ICCE) Committee to support the upcoming International Conference hosted by the SE Section in Charleston, SC in July. Though I initially volunteered to be the lead on the Hospitality Suite, I was asked because of my graphic background to layout the program and to sell ads for the program. I have been working hard to sell ads in hopes that the International Conference is funded.

I have been working closely with the Nashville Chapter to help their leadership get up and running. The Nashville Chapter has done a wonderful job at recruiting and is currently at 61 members. This chapter has gone from a dying chapter during COVID to new leadership and a thriving chapter within the last year. I have mentored one of the members as she went through the application process for the First Wings Award scholarship and will continue to mentor her as she finishes her private pilot certificate.

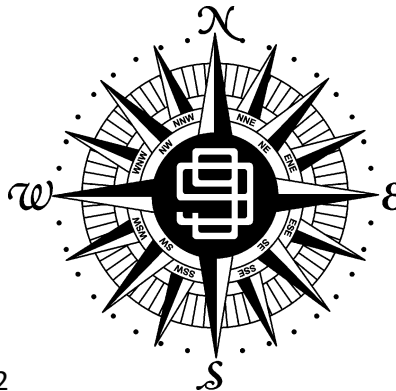

Airmarking

Where do you see the Ninety-Nine Logo in your communities?

- Flyer at your local airport
- Maybe on an article of clothing worn by a member
- The I am a Pilot Button
- Where else?

Branding is a way of defining a business to our members, and external audiences (aviation community, fellow aviators, and on social media).

Good brand identity will attract new members, supporters of the Ninety-Nines and new aviators to our local communities. So, if you are relying on your members to wear 99 articles of clothing or a flyer to draw new members for brand recognition then growth will be slow. Companies today use billboards or large advertisements in newspapers and internet sites. We as aviators have the best canvas, the airport tarmac, or hangar roof to place our brand for all to see, while at the airport or from the air. Did you know Air Marking started as a means of navigation in the 1930's. The Ninety-Nine brand has been around for 90+ years.

Now is a good time to check in with your local airports to see if there is a need to REFRESH or RENEW (much like make-up on our faces in the morning) markings on the airport (tetrahedron, landing markers, airport names or symbols or a compass rose). In these cases, the Ninety-Nines supply the WOMAN POWER to get the job done and the airport authority supplies the paint. Memphis has been able to lay down a compass rose complete with 2 coats of paint in an 8-hour period. Want to know how we are efficient at getting it done quickly? We have refined our processes and are willing to share our insights. So, round up your girlfriends, 491/2's, Friends of the Ninety-Nines, and your local aviation community members to assist in making our brand more recognizable. Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts like to get involved in community service activities too. Don't forget to ask your local newspaper to come out and promote the event. Carry on the tradition of air marking by the Ninety-Nines and add the NINETY-NINE BILLBOARDS to your local skies. When

Ninety-Nines travel around, I know they like to post aerial shots of compass roses on social media another great marketing tool in brand recognition.

HELPFUL HINTS: The airport's county highway department may have expired paint that you can use for the compass rose activities, since we typically use highway white and handicap blue to paint compass roses. Memphis chapter pours straight from 5-gallon buckets to the surface to eliminate paint waste and the number of supplies needed (don't need paint trays). Just need a few folks with paint rollers and sticks to spread the paint out before it dries.

Bylaws Committee

The Bylaws Committee met in October 2021 to review the SES bylaws. The last time they were reviewed was in 2016. The committee found two housekeeping amendments. They were submitted to the SES Board for review. The board recommends approving them at the Spring 2022 SES Annual Meeting.

Per the bylaws, they were distributed to all section members at least 60 days prior to the Spring meeting. They will be voted on at the SES Spring Meeting.

ARTICLE V. SECTION MEETINGS

Section 1. The Section shall meet annually at specific times and places according to a designated schedule established by the Board of Directors, hereinafter called The Board, and agreed to by the members at the previous annual meeting. If necessary, the Governor may change the time and place of a scheduled meeting, with proper notice to The Board and the membership. At any meeting of the members or the board, attendance may be by electronic means.

Annual Meeting. The regular business meeting in the Spring shall be known as the Annual Meeting and shall be for the purpose of receiving reports of officers and committees, for the installation of elected officers, and for other business that may arise.

Fall Meeting. A semi-annual meeting of The Board shall be held in the Fall at a place determined by The Board. Reports of officers and committees, and other business shall be transacted at the discretion of the Governor of The Board. ~~Section Committee Chairmen and Chapter Chairmen will be expected to attend.~~

ection 4. Officers shall be elected by a plurality of all ballots received. In the case of a tie, the members present at the next Section meeting shall elect that officer by a majority of votes using a written ballot. The Nominating Committee member receiving the highest number of votes will serve as committee chairman. **If no vote is taken, if no voting takes place,** the nominating committee shall select their chair by majority vote of the committee members.

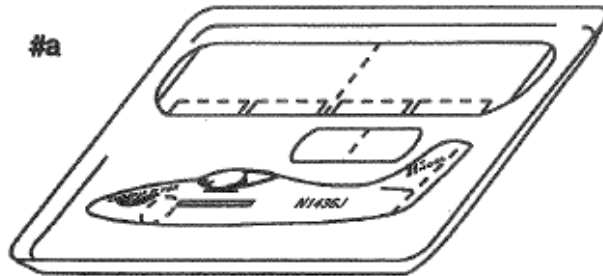

Sky School *CUDERIA FLYER*

Assembly Instructions

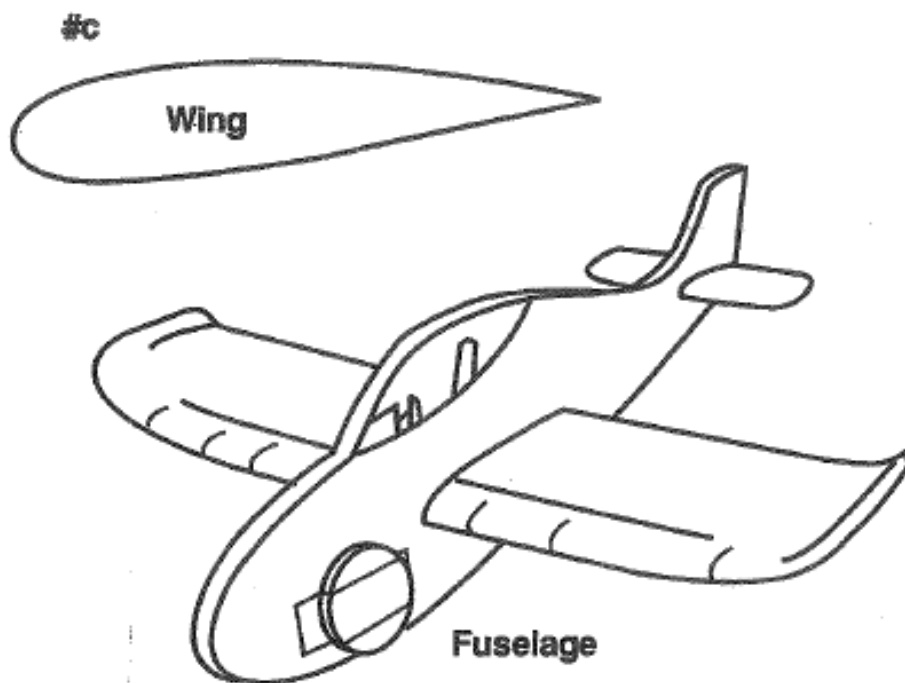
- 1-Cut wing, fuselage, and horizontal stabilizer from the styrofoam tray using templates. **NOTE:** Winglets can be formed from the factory bend of the tray edge. (*Illustration A*)



- 2-Using a ball-point pen, lightly score a line from the leading edge of the wing to the trailing edge at the wing center point. Repeat for the horizontal stabilizer. Score aileron, flap, and rudder outline on both sides being careful not to cut all the way through the styrofoam material. Scoring will allow bending without breaking the control surfaces.
- 3-With one end of the wing on a flat surface, bend the opposite end up 1 inch. As shown in *illustration B*, the wing now has dihedral.



- 4-Using a fingernail file, round the leading edge of the wing and tape the trailing edge. Repeat for the horizontal stabilizer. Round the fuselage edges. (*Illustration C*)



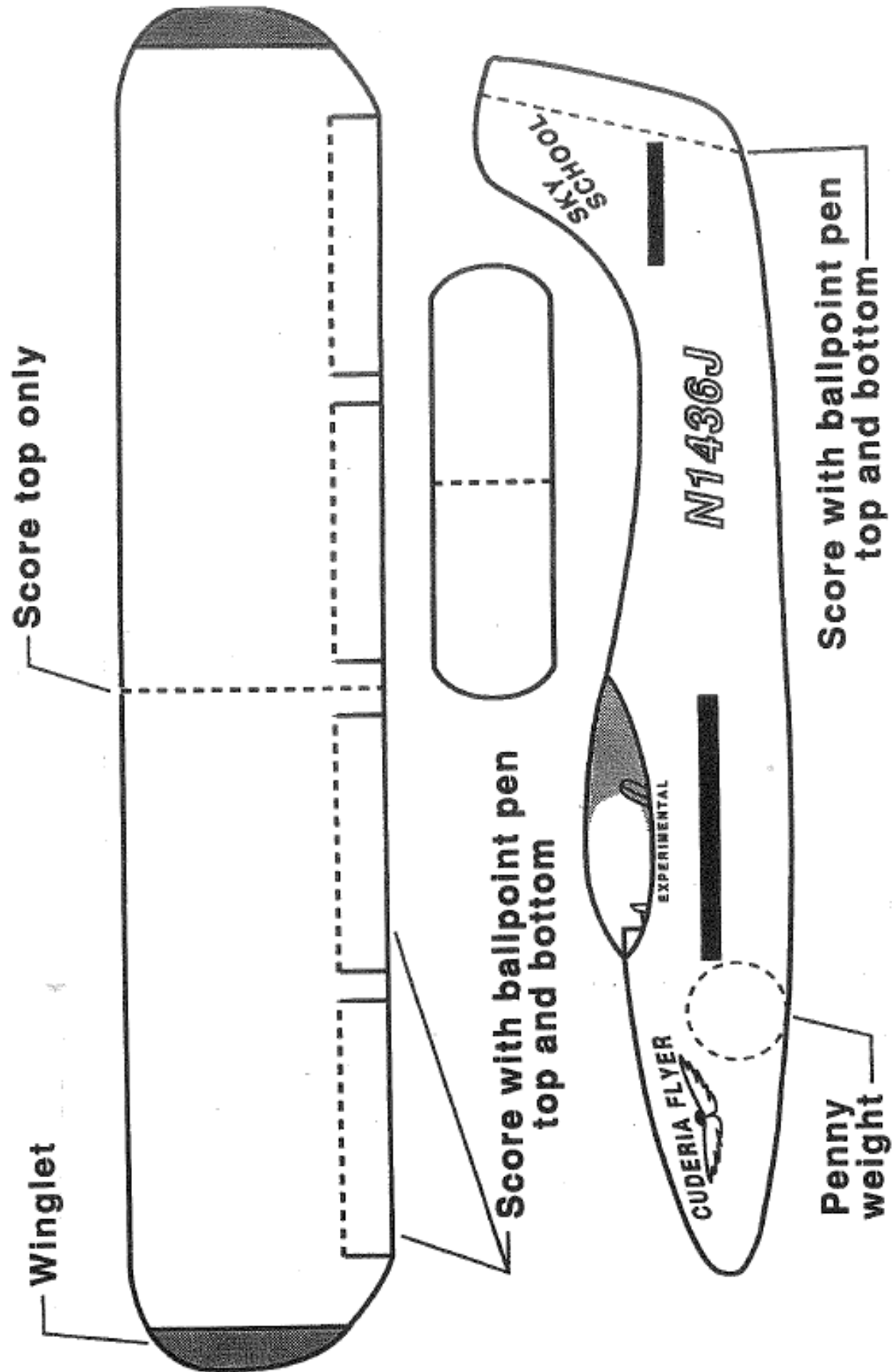
5-Mark an outline of each control surface and label. Apply personal and finishing touches to fuselage by drawing canopy outline, name, aircraft number, etc.

6-Assemble the glider by inserting wing and horizontal stabilizer into proper slots cut in the fuselage. Friction will hold them in place.

7-Attach a penny to the glider using tape or glue. This will provide ballast and balance to the penny. See the template for approximate position of the penny.

8-Test your **CUDERIA FLYER!** Ballast amount and location and position of the elevator will determine the flight characteristics. Test fly the **CUDERIA FLYER** using different elevator positions, ballast locations, and amount until ideal flight characteristics are observed.

Terms: dihedral, fuselage, stabilizer, elevator, rudder, wing, winglets, aileron, flaps, aeronautical engineer.

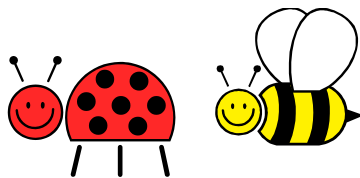

Never one to rest on her laurels, in 1981 she matriculated to the Emory University School of Medicine. While in medical school, she worked as a Physician's Assistant in Anesthesia and was on the Emory Faculty from 1981-82. Kathy received her Doctor of Medicine degree in 1985 from Emory University while pregnant with her second daughter. Kathy had a magnetic personality and loved fiercely. Kathy could light up a room with her smile and vivacious personality.

She drew people to her and had an infectious laugh. She treated everyone around her the same, regardless of their walk of life. Andy had always been fascinated with flight. When Andy told Kathy he wanted to learn how to fly, she started working towards her pilot certificate also. She had grown up watching the Blue Angels with her family and had herself been interested in pursuing a career as a pilot from a young age. Over the next 13 years, they spent countless hours in the air. Andy loved the challenge of flying, and Kathy loved visiting more people and places. They each attained various levels of airplane and instrument ratings. Never one to stop at mid-level, Kathy was in the process of getting her commercial pilot certificate.

ALABAMA CHAPTER:

July 28, 2021 Delores Morris



Delores Eckman Morris was age 91. Dee graduated from high school in 1948 and was accepted into pre-med at what is now Rice University. She wanted to be a surgeon. Ultimately, she would become a realtor. She had to forego her college plans because her father got sick, and she had to stay home and help her mother take care of him. She met and married Earl Morris in 1954. Earl was a pilot, first in the Air Force and then a commercial pilot, and Dee decided to get her pilot's license, too. Dee received her pilot's license and raced airplanes in competition. Earl and Dee owned and operated a small airfield, Dee's Flying Service, outside of Houston. She helped form the Montgomery Chapter of the Women's Council of Realtors and held several local and statewide and even national offices in that organization. In 1998, she was awarded Realtor of the Year and Woman Realtor of the year for Alabama. In 2009 she served as President of the Alabama Board of Realtors.

FLORIDA SUNCOAST CHAPTER:

November 31, 2021 Bertha Podwys



Bertha Podwys was age 99. Born on November 28, 1922, raised on her family's farm in Berwick Pennsylvania as the twelfth of thirteen children by Paul and Bertha Urban. As a young child, Bertha enjoyed playing outdoor sports with all her older brothers. So, it's no surprise that she would pursue a career which would do something involving planes. Her career started with Grumman Aerospace as a part assembly worker, and later with Northrup Grumman Aerospace as a bookkeeper. While working with Grumman, Bertha joined their bowling and golf teams and excelled and asked to be on the company's team of competition in both area of sports which would involve travelling within the United States and playing against other company teams in which she won several single and team tournaments and accumulated a vast collection of first place awards. Another item of noteworthiness is the process of how votes are casted... electronically through Election Buddy, or by physical mail. Based on experience as the Nominating Committee Chair for the previous term, I have found that electronic voting is the most time and cost-efficient way to conduct elections. **Everyone** needs to encourage our members to use electronic voting for our next election. If a member finds electronic voting to be difficult, I suggest another member, who is accessible, to walk that member through how the electronic voting works.

Both forms of ballots involve time and expense to our Section. To run our election using Election Buddy with electronic voting ballots, the Southeast Section paid \$89.00 in 2021. Great results in participation yielded from electronic voting. Paper voting ballots cost the Section \$50.60 for postage with very minimal response.

As a recap, the time and effort put into the election process for 2021 did not reflect in the same regard with the participation of voters. Having unopposed candidates may have been the reason behind these results. The Southeast Section Board and Nominating Committee have discussed revisiting the bylaws in reference to sending out ballots if candidates run unopposed. Voting for elections will take place in early March and end in early April... exact dates will be determined based on the date of the Spring 2023 Section Meeting.

Every election is a learning process, and we are still finding the best ways for the Ninety-Nines to participate and be involved. We urge our members to give advice and opinions to our Board and Nominating Committee. That is what will help the Southeast Section and the whole organization grow.

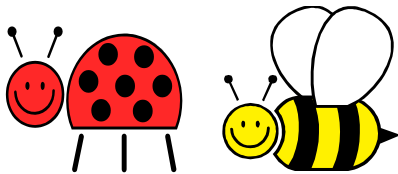
Volunteers are needed in several areas.
